















The Junior League of Pelham and the Pelham Union Free School District made great strides in revitalizing Julianne's Playground. Located on 6th Street in Pelham, this park honors the spirit of Julianne Borsella, an 8-year old who died from Ewing's Sarcoma. This park was a solace to her as she sat by the sunlit window at her house and watched children laugh and play. When she could, she would join them.

On February 15, 2023, the Pelham School District announced that the play structure that was originally destined for Hutchinson Elementary School would instead be donated to Julianne's Park, kicking off this phase of our Signature Project.

On April 10th, 2023, Julianne's birthday, we were excited to cut the ribbon on the new playground equipment intended for older children. We will all continue to unite to build the park into an inclusive environment for young and old, including accessible equipment and access during this multi-year project.

In May, JLP organized a special Mother's Day themed "photoshoot" in the park, setting up four professional photographers to do family or individual portraits. Additionally, thousands in funds were raised by other means.

The Signature Project committee is excited to continue fundraising and construction over the next few years.










Monthly GMMS

May: The End of Year dinner was held at the Pelham Country Club where we announced the annual award winners.
















FUNDRAISING REPORT


