The Junior League of Pelham's 80th year was marked by both the continued impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the worldwide rollout of a vaccine to combat it. Through it all, our members found more ways to help, both here in Pelham as well as in our neighboring communities.

Our Pelham Cares initiative served again as the cornerstone of our work, and the statistics reflect the dedication of our members, even as the pandemic wore on into a second year:

It is hard to believe the 2020-2021 JLP year has come to an end. Despite navigating through a global pandemic, virtual schooling, working from home, and isolation from family and friends – our League continued to make a difference. You might even say that our mission was more important than ever.

We are so grateful for all of the hours you contributed to make an impact in our community. We would also like to recognize the current Board, as it definitely wasn't the easiest of years, and this group of women made it feel effortless.

A few highlights from the year:

- Evolved the 2020 pandemic initiative, Pelham Cares, into a JLP project to help women and families most impacted by the pandemic
- Pivoted our prized JL of Scientists project to a virtual offering that included the distribution of several scavenger hunt kits
- Partnered with numerous community organizations, including Hearts and Homes for Refugees, My Sisters
 Place, Hope Soup Kitchen, and Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle to offer DIAD opportunities
- Joined forces with Pelham Civic Association to deliver two virtual Professional Prep career discussions

- Hosted the first virtual Community Roundtable to highlight the impact of COVID-19 on the emotional, mental, and overall wellbeing of youth in Pelham and the surrounding communities and the work being done by partner organizations to address these challenges
- Donated \$9,000 in grants to organizations that help meet urgent basic needs, especially in relation to COVID-19, support women and their wellbeing, and maintain support for projects and organizations that will most benefit from our funding
- Took our GMMs virtual with a focus on the wellbeing, personal and professional development of our membership, including Sustainers and New Members
- On-boarded one of the largest and most diverse New Member classes, and through their project, partnered with Lifting Up Westchester to donate over 100 care packages to young teenagers in need and source over \$12,000 worth of in-kind donations

We hope that you had a great summer with family and friends and come back recharged to hit the ground running with JLP. We look forward to working with our incoming 2021-2022 JLP Board and joining forces with each of you in your new JLP Placement roles.


JUNIOR LEAGUE OF SCIENTISTS



SCAVENGER HUNTS

To provide a fun, socially distanced way to engage kids in STEAM, the JLP held fall and winter science scavenger hunts for pre-k and elementary school children. We also distributed more than 100 science kits that could be safely done at home, helping kids enjoy hands-on science activities that may have been missing from virtual school.

The conclusion of the fall scavenger hunt coincided with the first night of Diwali, the festival of lights. The JLP's own Heena Jain read Let's Celebrate the 5 Days of Diwali by Ajanta Chakraborty and Vivek Kumar, and sunrise/sunset, shadows and colors experiments augmented learning about the celebration.





SPRING GROW KITS

The JLP provided 75 spring grow kits with enough seeds, dirt pellets and cups to complete one of three experiments with a budding kid scientist. These experiments showed how light, soil composition and the amount of water affects the growth of a sunflower.



In November, elementary school students had the opportunity to participate in the first "Ask a Scientist" guest speaker series, featuring Dr. Kim Riegel, assistant professor in physics at Queensborough Community College. Dr. Riegel studies acoustics, the physics of sound with a focus on noise control. She has done research in sonic booms, the sound an object makes when it travels faster than the speed of sound, urban noise, the study of how sound behaves in cities and how it affects its residents.

In March, JLP and the Pelham Public Schools Departments of Math and Science offered a virtual "Ask a Scientist" event for students in grades 6-9. This event featured Dr. Marine Frouin, a Professor of Geosciences at SUNY Stony Brook who specializes in Luminescence and Evolution.

May's "Ask a Scientist" was tailored to high school students who had the opportunity to learn from Ying Li, a Senior Software Engineer with Google. Ms. Li's experience includes designing, implementing, testing, and operating software systems on a large scale. Her focus is on making it easier for people to operate systems securely and identifying problems quickly.


Done-in-a-Day led numerous opportunities for members to give back to the community, including:

- Holding a Winter Clothing Drive for The Sharing Shelf
- Collecting donations for the Winter Coat and Boot Drive for Hearts and Homes for Refugees
- Coordinating a Toy Drive for thirty WestHELP families during the holidays
- Donating 12 baby layette kits and 12 baby hygiene kits to The Sharing Shelf in Spring 2021



ENDING HUNGER

Through partnerships with various community-based organizations, the JLP organized food drives, purchased and delivered groceries for individual families, and prepared large batch meals for local soup kitchens. For example, the End Hunger Committee collected "All The Trimmings" for the Thanksgiving meals provided by several soup kitchens in and around our community, including the CSA in Mt Vernon, Hope Kitchen in New Rochelle, and The New Rochelle Community Action Program Food Pantry.



COMMUNITY ROUNDTABLE: HELPING OUR YOUTH

Disconnection from community is one way COVID-19 is affecting the mental health of teens and pre-teens. To answer questions from the community on the topic, the Junior League of Pelham hosted its annual Community Roundtable on Friday, October 2nd. This live-streamed event featured panelists Laura Caruso from Pelham Together, Will Iannuzzi from the Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle, and Dr. Emily Upshur and Dr. Sarah Bren, who discussed the evolving emotional and mental needs of our youth in times of COVID-19 and how parents and community members can provide the best support in our "new normal."


This new Pelham Cares effort focuses on



Professional Prep


Professional Prep continued its community outreach by partnering with the Pelham Civic Association and the PMHS Counseling Department to host two Career Awareness panel discussions.

NYSPAC was proud to host our annual movie night in recognition of International Women's Day on March 8th! We selected "The Death and Life of Marsha P. Johnson," which chronicles the activism of Marsha P. Johnson and

Sylvia Rivera, prominent figures in gay liberation and transgender rights movement in New York City from the 1960s to the 1990s. The film centers on activist Victoria Cruz's investigation into Johnson's death in 1992 under

suspicious circumstances. This film is directly linked to NYSPAC's advocacy work on behalf of the well-being of our communities and all its members, notably in the recent repeal of the Walking While Trans Ban.

NYSPAC Winter Conference

NYSPAC hosted our first ever virtual Winter Conference via Zoom on Saturday, January 30th.

The training covered the current bills on our Federal slate: the Homeless Children and Youth Act, Runaway and Homeless Youth Act, and Emergency Family Stabilization Act. For our state slate, we covered the two most hot button issues: the Adult Survivor Act and the Walking While Trans Ban repeal. Over cookie and cocoa bomb platters personally coordinated by our chair Katelyn Galbraith, delegates learned the nuances of each bill, as well as pointers on how to reach out to elected officials to advocate for them.



PANEL DISCUSSION

NYSPAC conducted a panel discussion on April 14th on 'Activism, Advocacy, and Policy: Creating Radically Welcoming and Inclusive Communities Together.' Almost 100 participants from around Westchester heard the distinguished panel of activists and community leaders, and included Amy Paulin and guests from AJLI leadership (Anne Dalton, Emma Briggs). We were extremely grateful to witness the vulnerable, powerful, and moving testimonials of our panelists' professional and personal experiences.

Love Pelham Annual Fund



Throughout another difficult pandemic year, the JLP and our community showed once again the strength of community. We thank everyone who supported the Love Pelham Annual Fund through generous donations made online and in person at Pelham locations across

town. As a result of this year's campaign, the JLP was able to spread the love to many neighbors in Pelham and nearby communities. Funds raised went directly to the JLP's community projects, including delivery of home-cooked meals, public art, educational enrichment,

community grants, and most notably, our "Signature Project" of Julianne's Park. Every donation was recognized by a sparkling JLP snowflake and, with a gift of \$100 or more, this year's 2021 custom Love Pelham ornament, designed again by the talented local artist Katy Garry.










Meet the 2020-2021 Provisional Class


Heather Kidera

Amy Castle Platt



The Brighter Futures program works to provide individual and group tutoring four days a week in five different locations in Yonkers and White Plains.
