The Power Of Community In A Time Of Crisis



hen the severity of the COVID-19 pandemic became apparent in mid-March, JLP launched into action, partnering with Pelham Together, the Pelham Civic Association, and the Pelham Chamber of Commerce to form "Pelham Cares," with the mission of supporting local businesses while feeding frontline workers. The impact of a united front became instantly apparent, as the Pelham community rallied to raise \$30,000 in the joint group's first few days of fundraising.

While Pelham Cares was a collaboration, JLP took the lead, managing donations, identifying local businesses and frontliners who could use the support, and coordinating deliveries. Penny O'Brien and Kathleen Perrell immediately stepped forward, offering to take charge of all of the organization's logistics.

PRESIDENT'S LETTER



Dear Members:

As I reflect upon my year as JLP President, and the unexpected curveball(s) that 2020 threw our way, I am overcome with gratitude to have been a part of this organization—both as a platform for affecting change, and as a network of support in a time of crisis. I am so incredibly proud of all that we have accomplished together.

The pandemic has forced us all to take stock of what's

important, and to prioritize what matters most. We should all take great pride in looking back at the 2019-2020 year and remembering that together, we did the following:

- Provided \$6,500 in grant money to local organizations
- Raised nearly \$50,000 through JLP fundraisers
- Raised a combined total of nearly \$50,000 to support local businesses and front-liners impacted by the pandemic with Pelham Cares
- Through our Backpack Program, delivered 240 bags of groceries to families who frequent the New Rochelle Boys & Girls Club
- Through our CSA program, made 27 lunch deliveries to the Mount Vernon soup kitchen
- Held 5 DIAD events to assist other local organizations
- The Junior League of Scientists led 5 science lessons for kids, including two virtual experiences
- JLP Reads hosted 12 reading sessions at the Pelham Library
- Professional Prep hosted two career workshops for PMHS students
- Provided a deserving PMHS graduate with a \$2,000 scholarship
- · And, more!

None of this would have been possible without the commitment of our talented, smart, and hardworking membership. I'm especially appreciative of this year's Board of Directors (Susan Quintin, Penny O'Brien, Meredith McGinn, Sing Duffy, Abby Balafas, Beth Ritchie, Bridget Messina, Rachel Springer, Devie Perry, Sandy Horan, Joanna Boyle, and Dawn Bloise), who led with great dedication and care.

"Pelham Cares was such an incredible and enlightening experience for me at a personal level," Penny said. "It was humbling to be able to support doctors and nurses on the front lines while also directly much-needed business to local businesses, none off which could have happened without the generosity of the Pelham community."

Ultimately, Pelham Cares raised approximately \$50,000, all of which was funneled immediately into Pelham restaurants and other small businesses, with meals and other essentials going directly to front-liners working at hospitals, the police and fire departments, and more.

"Pelham by nature is such a strong community, and people want to help," JLP President Lisa Horten said. "We wanted to provide a bit of hope in a time that feels kind of hopeless—we wanted to be able to do something that's really impactful."

- 22 Pelham healthcare workers families received "thank yous" at home (flowers/plants, gift cards for restaurants in town and Pelham Art Center art kits).
- The Prospect Hill teachers association asked the PTA to forgo their usual Teacher Appreciation gifts, and instead **donated** \$1,000 to Pelham Cares
- Colonial held a "Quarantine Read-a-Thon," raising \$3,000 for Pelham Cares
- We delivered 50 totes of pantry staples and other household essentials (all donated by the Pelham community) for families impacted by COVID at the Children's Hospital at Montefiore
- We supplied hospitals with special requests including hand cream, lip balm, hand sanitizers and cleaning products
- We provided toys and other educational items from the Pelham business community to the Jewish Child Care Association
- We provided the group of hard-working Pelham mask sewers with a Cafe Ammi coffee tab



Signature Project



This year, we laid the groundwork for the Julianne's Park Project, with an estimated completion date of 2022. We hired Sean Jancski Landscape Architects to work on the project, and went through a few rounds of conceptual planning before discussing options and budget with the JLP board.

In November, we unveiled the conceptual plan to the public at the Junior League Roundtable. After a lively conversation, we compiled the feedback received and made revisions to the plan. With the support of the Borsella family, Julianne's parents, we prepared to host focus groups in late March based on the new concept. Unfortunately, we had to cancel these groups due to the pandemic.

Backpack Program

The Backpack Program continued its partnership with DeCicco & Sons in Pelham and the Boys & Girls Club of New Rochelle to deliver 240 bags of groceries to families in New Rochelle.

The Junior League of Scientists

Toddlers in Science kicked off its second year by offering a thoughtful program aimed at dispelling stereotypes and to promote the idea of women in STEAM. The group has renamed itself "The Junior League of Scientists" to better reflect a broader target audience.

The Junior League of Scientists partnered with Pelham Reads' "Hidden Figures" on the lawn of the Pelham Library to put

together an interactive trip around the Solar System, where children could get a sense of life on each planet. The committee hosted two in-person science lessons: a plant lesson at Junior Wonders and an electricity lesson at Colorful Sunburst.

Due to COVID-19, the committee quickly pivoted to virtual lessons, hosting an inaugural collaboration with the Pelham School District Science department to bring a Virtual Earth Day STEAM event to 160 people within the community's K-5 families. The final event of the year was a second collaboration with the Pelham School District Science department to host the inaugural STEAM Day 2020, which included the May STEAM Challenge Showcase, Senior Rocket Launch, career panels, and a community movie, among other activities.

Done in a Day

Done in a Day led numerous opportunities for members to give back to the community, including:

- Staffing the annual Pelham Children's Center Pumpkin Festival and Kids Fun Run
- Collecting 50 halloween costumes for children at My Sisters' Place
- Coordinating a Holiday Toy Drive to benefit the children of CSA Mt, Vernon and HOPE New Rochelle

As part of DIAD, Pass it on, Pelham! held a Winter Accessory Drive for My Sisters' Place and partnered with the Pelham Half-Marathon to collect over 60 coats to benefit Hearts and Homes for Refugees, CSA Mt. Vernon, and HOPE New Rochelle.



The Community Affairs Committee is very pleased and excited to announce our 2020 Grant Recipients. All organizations will direct grant proceeds towards improving the lives and health of families, promoting education and/or enriching Pelham or neighboring communities. Thank you to all of the organizations that applied and congratulations to our grant recipients!



The Baby Bank of Westchester is a not-for-profit organization aimed to support neighbors in the community who struggle to meet basic needs such as food, clothing, shelter, medical care, and education. The \$1,000 JLP grant was able to fund over 4,000 diapers to local at-risk babies.



Hope's Door is a not-forprofit which seeks to end domestic violence and empower victims to achieve safety, independence, and healing from the trauma of abuse. The \$1,250 JLP grant provided funding toward their Next Step Fund, which gives domestic abuse victims access to vocational/ educational training, money for licenses, etc.



Pelham Together is a not-for-profit community coalition aimed to create a vibrant and healthy community for and with the youth of Pelham. The \$1,500 JLP grant will fund the training needed to become certified trainers of Youth Mental Health First Aid, which teaches the warning signs and the risk factors of mental health challenges among adolescents.



Songcatchers

is a not-for-profit that provides affordable access to high quality music education to low income children ages 1.5-13. The \$500 JLP grant provided funding for 2 new violins.



Women's Enterprise Development Center is a not-for-profit micro-enterprise development program formed to help women achieve economic self-sufficiency through small business development. The \$1,000 JLP grant provided funding for the training and marketing for two workshops aimed at local small business owners.



The Ladies of Charity of the Pelhams is a

not-for-profit primarily devoted to women and children's causes, namely to provide knit and crocheted blankets and other textiles to babies born to young mothers in need. The \$500 JLP grant will provide funding for the yarn needed for ongoing community needs.




The Pelham Art Center

Each year since 1987, the \$2,000 Junior League of Pelham Scholarship has been awarded to a deserving female PMHS senior who has demonstrated outstanding community service. The 2020 scholarship was granted by JLP's executive board to the incredibly impressive Stephanie Munn, who will be starting as a freshman at McGill University this Fall. "The past four years at PMHS have been wonderful and I've learned so much! I'm very grateful to the Junior League of Pelham for the scholarship and can't wait to put it to good use at McGill University this fall," Stephanie shared. Her robust high school resume includes starting and leading the PMHS Chapter of "Students for Refugees," a club designed to educate, fundraise, and help resettle refugees in Westchester and abroad. A native of Moscow, Russia, Stephanie's family moved to Pelham when she was 14. She told us that the welcome she got from this community inspired her to want to do the same for others. Stephanie also volunteered her time as a babysitter for two refugee families as they settled in White Plains. Throughout her high school career, Stephanie interned at Hearts and Homes for Refugees, and volunteered at organizations including Access Equestrian, Confident Kid Club, and the International Rescue Committee. We can't wait to see what this inspiring young woman accomplishes next.


Louisa Augeri


Stacy Yan


Provisional Class MLK Jr. Service Event

The MLK, Jr. Day Service Fair was a true testament to the hard work, talent, and commitment of this year's provisional class. So many Pelham residents showed up to participate and create donations that the Provisionals made emergency trips to Target and DeCicco's for more supplies! These donations will have a real impact on our extended community and the event provided service and educational opportunities to Pelhamites of all ages. We are thrilled to officially welcome this incredible group of women into the JLP!









NYSPAC

The 2019-2020 NYSPAC agenda came out of the gate strong this year and made great strides in its efforts to advocate for the health and welfare of women and children across New York State.

NYSPAC is a coalition of 17 Junior Leagues from across NewYork state, representing more than 7,500 women, with a focus on public policy, and having a positive impact on women, health, children and families.

Each year, NYSPAC's participating leagues vote on the particular issues for which we will advocate. However, it is the legislative agenda that drives

the trainings and we have a set agenda of issues and bills every year. For 2019-20, we focused on:

The HCYA/RHYA
Automatic Voter Registration
Dating Violence Curriculum
Human trafficking bills related to
services for survivors
Extending the look back window
for the Child Victims Act
Adult Survivors Act

As part of the training, Aileen Dose and Romina Levy traveled to Albany for the annual Winter Conference to learn about coalition-building and advocacy, as well as how to support passage of the Homeless Children and Youth Act (HCYA), one of NYSPAC's main issues for 2019-20.

Topics covered at the Conference include:

- The various forms of homelessness and how many individuals were not being counted/did not qualify for services under the limited scope of current legislation, which the HCYA's homeless definition model sought to remedy.
- How the League of Women Voters advocates for the enfranchisement of all voices, especially marginalised populations.

- The realities of human trafficking: what it looks like, vulnerable populations and what we can do.
- Action items we can take to be effective advocates such as letter writing, emailing, and phone banking, as well as how to prepare for and conduct in-person meetings with our regional representatives.

In support of these selected topics and initiatives, e-blasts were sent to the Pelham league with links to advocacy letters, sample scripts and additional information. Our success stories include a meeting with Congressman Eliot Engel's chief of staff to review the HCYA and ask for his support.

Additionally, Congressman Engel signed on to co-sponsor the bill within several days of our meeting. Automatic Voter Registration also passed in NYS, making us only the second state to do so. Our current initiative is to advocate for the Runaway Children and Youth Act as well as Adult Survivors Act, which both offer further assistance and protections to some of our most vulnerable populations.

Another highlight was our first NYSPAC movie night where we screened Iron Jawed Angels in celebration of the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment, granting women the right to vote. We are planning to host a similar event this upcoming March to continue celebrating the work of the women who have come before us, and honor that memory by continuing to serve.


